What is a GP?

General practitioners (GPs) treat all common medical conditions and refer patients to hospitals and other medical services.

Why should I register with a GP?

Registering with a GP means you can easily book an appointment with a doctor if you or someone in your family is unwell.

How can I register with a GP?

Find your local GP with the search tool at the link above and contact them directly. Ask for an interpreter if you need one by saying "I need an interpreter please" and the language you need.

Your step by step guide to registering yourself and your family with your local GP.

1. Find your local GP

Visit the link above and use the search function to find out which GP is nearest to you.

2. Contact them to ask about registration

If you would find it easier to use an interpreter, ask for one by saying "I need an interpreter please" and the language you speak.

3. Complete and return the registration forms

If you are unsure about anything on the form, call the practice for help. They may want to come in to show some ID once they have your forms. This is perfectly normal and nothing to worry about.

When your registration has been received by the GP practice they will contact you to let you know if your application to register has been successful.
